Summer is in full swing here in Canal Fulton, and with the warmer weather we have seen an increase in the projects that are being accomplished throughout the city. I wanted to take this opportunity to give an update on many of the things we are currently working on.

You probably noticed all of the road construction that has taken place in the downtown area. Asphalt work has been completed on many of the downtown streets. Later this summer, we will also have new light poles, decorative trash cans, and park benches. These upgrades will help to revitalize

our Historic District while preserving the timeless charm that has made Canal Fulton a tourist destination for decades.

The Summer Concert Series is well underway, and one major change from last year's events is the expansion of our DORA (Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area). DORA beverages can now be purchased at all participating locations (Miller Doan, Canal Boat Lounge, Barrel Room, and the VFW), and taken into the Amphitheatre area. DORA was also expanded to include the Ohio & Erie Canal, so patrons can now enjoy an adult beverage while riding the canal boat.

And speaking of the canal boat... The St. Helena III is back on the water! After months of agonizing repairs and upgrades, the canal boat is fully operational. The city is still putting together a schedule for general admission rides, so make sure you're following the City of Canal Fulton Parks & Recreation Facebook page for updates. We are also planning our annual Halloween Haunted Boat Rides, so watch for ticket sales to begin in early Fall.

Finally, we are working on building a new disc golf course. This 9-hole course will be located in the wooded area between the Northwest Stark Senior Center and the Canal Fulton Safety Center on Locust St. The tentative date for opening is mid-August, but a number of things need to be completed in order to achieve this goal. The course will be a great addition to the new Community Park.

This is just a fraction of the many things we are currently working on within the city. In my Spring Newsletter article, I outlined the many personnel changes that have occurred throughout our administration. As everyone continues to grow into their positions, I believe even bigger and better things are on the horizon for our great city.

The words are difficult for me to find to express my gratitude for all of the blessings we have here in Canal Fulton. It is so exciting to see old buildings coming to life again through the efforts and investments of so many people. Owning and renovating an older property is really expensive. To see the commitment made by Mike and Chrissy Widuck in the Happy Days property at 143 N. Canal and now at the Warehouse on the Canal is truly humbling. Then we have the Truax family who purchased the former Oser's Ice Cream & Deli business and building at 102 N. Canal Street. The grand opening for Almost Heaven Ice Cream is set for June 26th. Please patronize them to bless them for their belief in the people of Canal Fulton. And how about Denny Brown, who saved the "Pink House" after a fire when most people would have taken the easy way out and demolished the property. His efforts produced an AirBNB for visitors to enjoy all that our community has to offer. Of course, these visionaries are following the footprints of others such as Bud Graham 215 Market St. W. (formerly the Glassworks). Now owned and operated by Sean and Tiffany Craney who have continued to improve and develop the property as the Dragonfly Tea Room and Dragonfly Winery. Prior to their vision we were blessed to have Scott Vandenberg and his vision for the Union Block Building. Scott's investment provided current space for local businesses such as

Rhinestones.Co, Deliciously Different, Canal Fulton Music and Speak Easy Coffee Shop as well as residential living space in the Historic District. Another example of investment in the preservation and improvement of Canal Fulton is the Board of the Canal Fulton Public Library. Their investment to the inside and outside of the former Muhlhauser home is a tribute to our heritage. Finally, speaking of heritage, the Canal Fulton Heritage Society owns and maintains several properties within the city including the Oberlin House (225 E. Cherry), Blank House (116 S. Canal) and the Canal Fulton Museum (102 Tuscarawas). This dedicated group of volunteers has worked tirelessly to maintain and improve the afore mentioned properties.

The City of Canal Fulton is trying to do our part by investing in infrastructure of the Historic District with projects such as; asphalt road repaving, crosswalk replacements, light pole replacement and purchasing new trash cans and benches. Also, Council approved the creation of a Historic Downtown Loan Program to enable businesses to borrow up to \$3,600 interest free to make improvements to their properties. The Canal Boat Lounge was the first to take advantage of the program and paint the front of their business. As I said, my gratitude is difficult to express, but, as always, I give all glory to God.



- 6. Once you have completed the form, click the "Submit" button, and your application will be complete!


We understand that everyone has their preferred payment methods. Therefore, payments for any certificates can be made either in person or online.

This summer we saw an increase in thefts, specifically golf carts from Clay's Park. You cannot always completely prevent something from being stolen, but there are easy ways to deter someone from stealing. First off is to lock your belongings, whether it is a car door, a shed door, or your house. In my 20 years with the police department, I have only received a couple of reports where a car window was broken out. It may not always be the most convenient, but taking valuables out of your car will also deter theft. A tablet sitting on a seat in view is an easy target. For things like golf carts, 4-wheelers, and such, remove the key. Some things like golf carts use a common key, so just taking the key may not be enough. Using some type of wheel lock or cable lock will help prevent them from being moved. When you purchase recreation vehicles, make sure to take pictures of them and the serial number or VIN. Unless you have something that is unique, a lot of them look alike and the VIN is the best way to identify who it belongs too. If there are markings or decals that are unique, take pictures of those too!

Pet Summer Safety

Summer temperatures are in full swing! Animals don't respond to the heat the same way people do. Dogs, for example, don't sweat through their skin. They cool themselves down by panting and sweating through their paw pads. Here are a few pet safety tips for the summer heat:

- Remember that cars heat up extremely fast even with the windows cracked!
- Make sure that your pets have access to shade and fresh water at all times. Temperatures in your yard can increase to high levels in just a few hours, and heat stroke can become a serious issue.

Signs of heat stress in animals include:

- Heavy, loud breathing
- Lack of appetite
- Rapid heartbeat
- Restlessness Lethargy, lack of energy
 Lack of coordination
- Excessive thirst
- Vomiting

What to do:

- Get the animal to a cool place or shade & provide water to drink
- Apply a cold towel or ice pack to the animal's head, neck, and chest
- Immerse the aminal in tepid (not cold) water
- Seek veterinary care immediately

Friend or Foe?

While we all try to get our gardens growing with decorative flowers at this time of year, five wildflowers (weeds) have been designated as noxious and undesirable in our area. They include Canada Thistle a.k.a. Creeping Thistle, Wild Carrot a.k.a. Queen Anne's Lace, Ox-Eye Daisy, Wild Parsnip, and Wild Mustard. Property owners in the township are encouraged to maintain their acreage and to control the spread of noxious weeds. If you have identified noxious weeds on your property, the township zoning and road departments ask that you mow at least twice yearly. Weed killer may also be applied to control the proliferation of weeds.

Visit your local lawn and garden or hardware store to inquire about safe weed control products designed to kill weeds but not harm the environment or water sources.

Zoning Permits the Convenient Way



A Zoning Permit is required if you are constructing, enlarging, or building a garage, shed, deck, gazebo, installing a pool or home addition. If you have any questions whether a permit is required, please contact the Zoning Department at (330) 854-7118. Permit applications may be obtained on-line or at the Lawrence Township Administration Building, 5828 Manchester Avenue N.W. Monday through Thursday, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

The township has provided a very convenient way of submitting zoning applications and receiving your zoning permit on-line by using our Zoning Department web page located on our website (lawrencetwp-oh.org). Applicants can forward all maps, drawings, septic approval forms and applications and also receive their zoning permits using this site. This makes the permit process much more efficient and will save the applicant from using their lunch break to obtain a permit!

Garage, Estate & Yard Sales



A permit is not required for a residential garage, yard or estate sale or sign. However, a garage, yard or estate sale sign shall not be posted on any utility pole and shall not be placed as to obstruct traffic, sight lines or street intersections.

Please make sure not to place the sign in the public right-of-way and remember to remove the sign upon the conclusion of the sale. Any sign that has not been removed will be removed and discarded by the township.

Sparky the Fire Dog

He's tall, spotted, and ready to pitch in to teach children all about being safe. Sparky is the Canal Fulton - Lawrence Township Fire Department's newest member; he will be taking to the road to visit local daycares and spread fire safety messages this summer.

Canal Fulton - Lawrence Township Fire Department received a grant from FM Global to purchase Sparky the Fire Dog®, the best-known figure in fire prevention today. A trademark character of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), Sparky The Fire Dog is at the center of the NFPA's Learn Not to Burn® program, one of the most comprehensive safety programs.

The mascot officially took his oath of office from Chief Yerian and began the job on June 5th at the Lawrence Township Trustees-Stark County Trustee meeting. With his colorful yellow and red fire jacket, helmet, and boots, Sparky will visit schools to share time with children, offer information about being safe, and be a good friend.

Chief Yerian is quoted as saying, "It's all about keeping children engaged when it comes to spreading important information."

This summer, you may see some large trailers at our Lawrence Township, Strausser Street, N.W. fire station. The Canal Fulton - Lawrence Township Fire Department will host two regional fire department training sessions. The Ohio Fire Academyís (OFA) Close to Home training



will bring out their Driving simulation and Fire Behavior lab. These training series bring state-of-the-art training to our area firefighters versus traveling to the Columbus Academy.

We strive to provide the highest level of fire, rescue, and hazardous materials training to our emergency service personnel, ensuring they're prepared to keep our community safe.

What services does Canal Fulton - Lawrence Township Fire Department provide?

Members of the Department are trained for an all-hazards emergency response. The Department's core functions are fire suppression, emergency medical response, hazardous materials response, fire prevention, and education. Members of the Department respond to all significant events, such as ice storms, snowstorms, major electrical outages, floods, and any other emergent needs from homeowners in the community. Members of the Department do much more than respond to emergencies as well. Other programs offered by the Department include child passenger safety restraint installations, babysitting classes, smoke alarm installs, CPR and defibrillator training, and fire extinguisher training.



Safety Town Registration

Northwest Safety Town is a 1-week summer program that introduces safety awareness to incoming kindergartners in a fun, interactive, miniature-town environment. Each day consists of visits from community professionals like police and firemen, group safety lessons, songs, and poems, driving pedal cars in the "town", and other hands-on experiences to reinforce safety concepts.

In general, many of us are walking, running and playing outside, while the weather is good. The Village of Clinton should be a place where all residents and visitors can safely enjoy their outdoor adventures. The rate of speed at which motorists are traveling through the Village have several residents and Council Members concerned. No road in the Village has a speed limit over 35 mph. All streets in the downtown area, are posted at 25 mph. Yet, on any given day you can see motorists zooming down Main Street, Clinton Rd, both S. Cleve-Mass and Cleveland Massillon Roads, at speeds well over the 35mph maximum limit. The Village Council has asked New Franklin police to take measures to discourage speeding and crack down on excessive offenders. Rest assured ,this is not a ploy to collect fines. The Village does not receive any revenue from traffic tickets. It's about the peace of mind and safety of our residents.


Another issue of concern is parking on sidewalks and keeping them clear and open. It is against the Village Ordinances to obstruct a sidewalk, in any





way. Which includes overhanging vegetation, as well as overgrowth on the sidewalk, itself. Residents with sidewalks, along their property, are responsible for keeping them clear of vegetation both on the ground and overhead. Also, keeping trash cans on a sidewalk is considered an obstruction. Parking on sidewalks, can become particularly, problematic. The constant weight of vehicles parked on a sidewalk, which runs over a culvert, can damage the culverts infrastructure. Also, it causes the sidewalk to deteriorate more rapidly. Sidewalks are made to be walked on, not parked on. It's as simple as that.
